Important Note for families with 4th – 8th graders:

4th – 8th grade students receive letter grades in music/choir. To fulfill the state performance standard and receive a passing grade for Tri. 2, all students are required to attend the Christmas concert. Should your child miss the concert, they will need to make up the work by attending one Monday night Children's Choir rehearsal and singing at one 10:30am Sunday mass before the end of Tri. 2*.
