The teachers will be waiting in their assigned sections at the church. Please have your child to their teacher no later than 5:45 so the teachers can take attendance and ensure everyone is lined up correctly.

During the concert

- Please keep the side aisles as clear as possible, and the center aisle completely clear.
- K-8 students will remain with their teachers for the entirety of the concert. (Pre-school students will be escorted to their parents after they finish singing.)

Important Note for families with 4th – 8th graders:

4th – 8th grade students receive letter grades in music/choir. To fulfill the state performance standard and receive a passing grade for Tri. 2, all students are required to attend the Christmas concert. Should your child miss the concert, they will need to make up the work by attending one Monday night Children's Choir rehearsal and singing at one 10:30am Sunday mass before the end of Tri. 2*. Arrangements for Children's Choir attendance should be scheduled in advance. Below are the two options:

Mass: Sunday, March 3 (9:45 – 11:30am)
