#### **News and Reminders**

**Child Illness** - If your child is absent due to illness, please let the office know the main symptom(s) of the illness. This helps us to track illnesses in our building. Thank you!

**Scent Free** - Transfiguration School is becoming a scent free building. We have several employees and children for whom strong smells cause a severe physical reaction. Therefore, we are asking all staff, children, and visitors to refrain from using perfume, cologne, and strongly scented hand lotion or sanitizer. Thank you for your help!

**Make-up/Earrings** - Students in grades K-5 are not permitted to wear cosmetics, according to our uniform policy. This includes mascara, eye liner and lip gloss. Students in these grades arriving with make-up will be asked to wash it off. Girls in Middle School are allowed to wear a modest amount of make-up. All girls who choose to wear earrings must use stud earrings only; nothing hanging or dangling. This is for their safety.
